We are thrilled to welcome residents home at Third Thyme in Los Angeles. With 104 new homes for seniors, including seniors who have experienced homelessness, this community represents safety and a fresh start. **“After living on the street, I am so grateful for my new home,”** said new resident Anthony.

As you turn these pages, I hope you pause to take in the bigger picture of what your support has made possible. Today, WHCHC serves over 1,600 people in 1,054 units across 25 buildings in four cities and two counties! From West Hollywood to Palm Springs, from Glendale to Long Beach, we have built homes and provided services that move community members from insecurity to stability. And we are not slowing down. We are currently in predevelopment in Beverly Hills, Culver City, Long Beach, Los Angeles, Palm Springs, and West Hollywood, because as long as there is a need, we will keep doing what we do.

This year holds a very special milestone for us. In December, WHCHC turns 40. Yes, four decades of opening doors, transforming lives, and proving that affordable, beautiful housing is the key to economic mobility and breaking the cycle of poverty. We will mark the occasion in style with a special anniversary event in early 2027, and we cannot wait to celebrate with you.

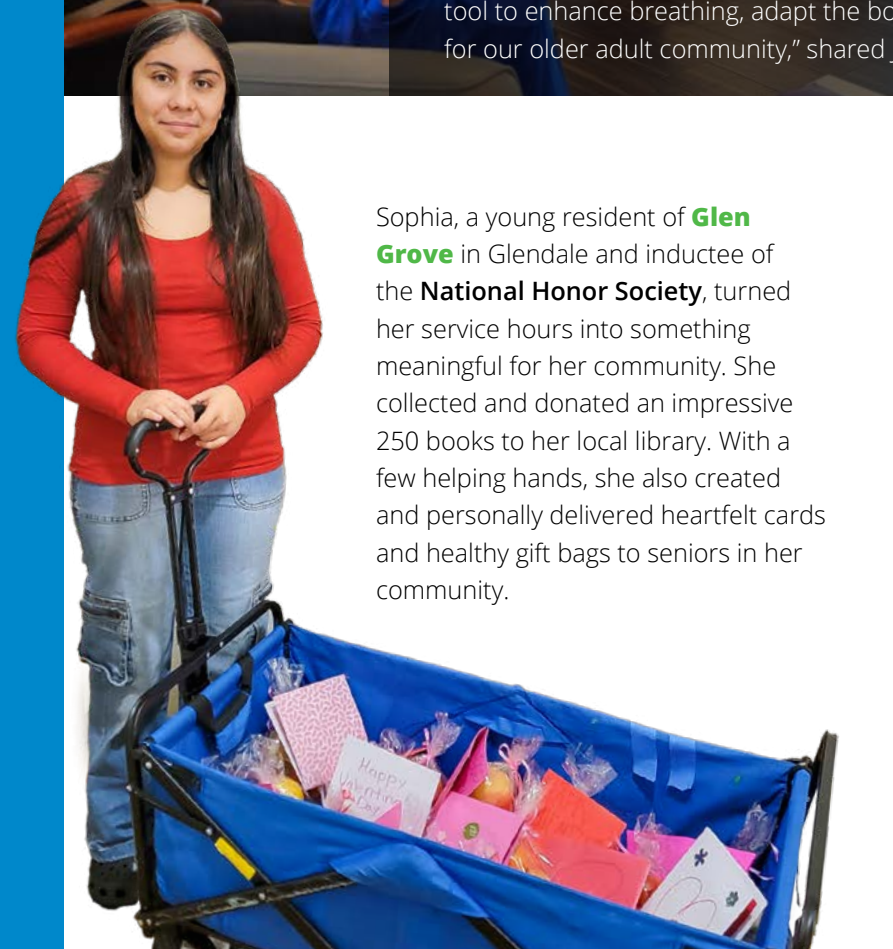

Third Thyme is coming to life as enthusiastic residents settle into their new homes in Los Angeles' Westlake North neighborhood. Serving extremely low- to low-income seniors, Third Thyme creates a permanent foundation for residents to experience the relief of housing security, age in place peacefully and engage in their community. This 104-unit affordable housing community includes 50 units now home to low-income older adults, while 52 units are leased through referrals from the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority's Coordinated Entry System, providing formerly unhoused seniors with a safe and stable place to call home.

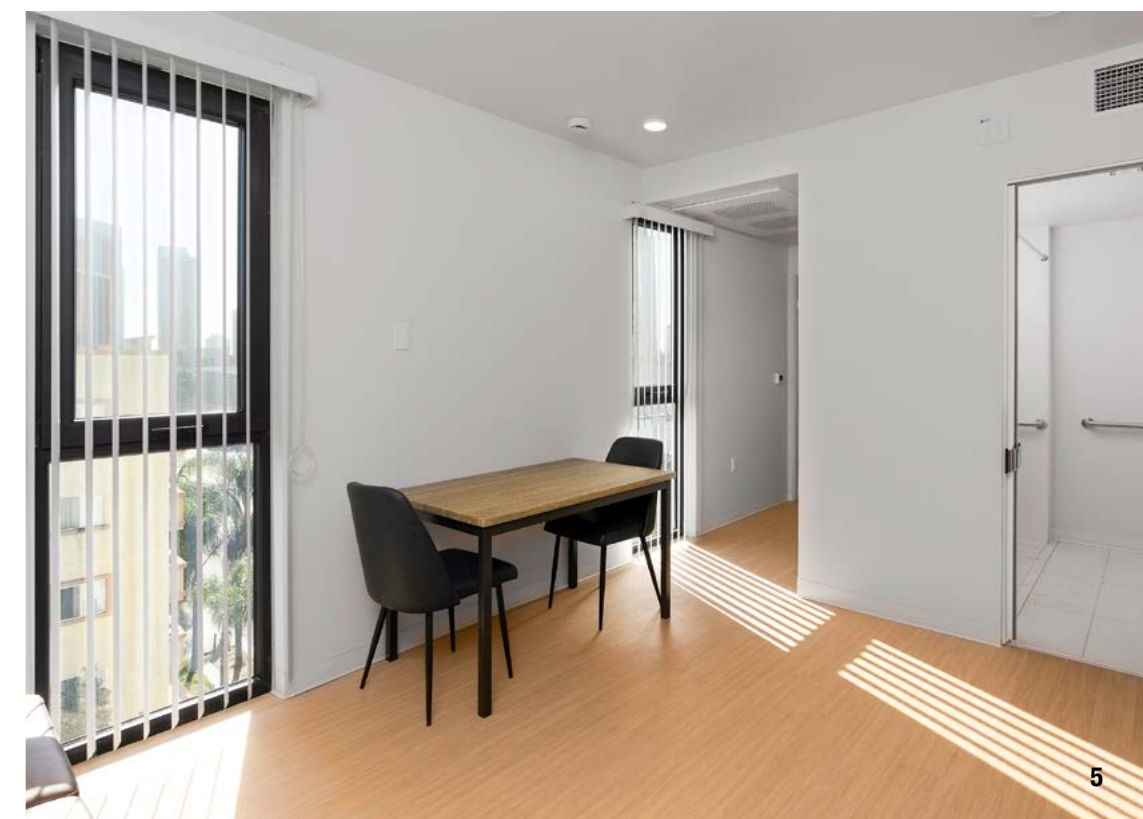
Residents enjoy sweeping views of greater Los Angeles, creating a vibrant sense of place and pride in their new community. At the heart of Third Thyme is a welcoming community room with a demonstration kitchen that will serve as the center of activities, celebrations, wellness programs and resident gatherings. Additional amenities include a computer lab, shared outdoor spaces, a central open-air courtyard and laundry facilities. On-site resident services and property management offices are available to support residents' long-term success. Third Thyme reflects a thriving community where older adults can live safely, independently, and with dignity for years to come.
