

Congratulations to Lamar from **Vermont Manzanita** in Los Angeles for winning his very own custom designed Vans at the annual STOKED showcase! STOKED is a yearlong youth empowerment program.



Twenty-one of the units provide homes for families who have experienced homelessness. Twenty units house low-income households and families making up to 50% of the area median income (AMI). Berendo Sage is a mix of one, two and three bedrooms, with one two-bedroom unit reserved for a full-time onsite building manager. All of the units incorporate universal design principles to be functional and practical for people both with and without mobility impairments.
